President's Message

Happy New Year and welcome back to school!! I hope you all had a wonderful winter break.

Registration for this coming fall is upon us. Returning families will be happy to note a decrease in the registration fee. Please see the information below from our registration chair, Alison Jensen. Our parent board met in December and discussed our budget at length for the 20/21 school year. It was decided that our wonderful teachers should get a cost of living increase. Tuition will be raised for each class (with a nominal activity fee increase).

A comprehensive evaluation of other preschools in the area was completed and it was determined that our tuition was low in comparison. As our operational costs increase, and looking ahead, we want to ensure that our school is financially sound. We do not want to undervalue the worth of JKCP, which can happen if our tuition is significantly lower than the surrounding schools. In comparison to other schools we evaluated, JKCP is still very reasonably priced. If you have any questions or concerns about the tuition increase or the right class for your child, please speak to Mrs. James.

One of the special things about January at JKCP is the start of Community Helpers. If you have a career or an interesting hobby which you would like to share with the children, please see Mrs. James. Children are so eager to learn, and family members are the perfect people to teach them. It is such a special occasion for a child to have a family member "teach" the class. Mrs. James is flexible in terms of scheduling our guest speakers. The presentation usually does not take longer than 10-15 minutes, but the benefit to the children is immeasurable.

Valentine's Day Party Info:

Valentines will be in the stores soon, so we want to let you know about our upcoming Valentine's Day Parties. We ask that you do <u>not</u> purchase valentines with candy. We want the children to appreciate the cards and not get distracted by any candy enclosed or attached. Also, <u>please do NOT address the valentines with classmates' names.</u>

The 3am parents can sign their child's name. If you are in the 4am or Pre-K class we encourage you to have your child begin signing their name on their cards soon, a few each day so that they will avoid trying to sign them all at once. This is such good practice for writing names - upper case for first letter and lower case for the remaining letters. You can help your child by writing their name with a yellow marker, or light pencil, for them to trace if needed. If they need more room to write their name, attaching a slip of paper to their card may be a good idea.

At the party we will have special food, and each child will have a turn to pass out their valentine cards around the circle. When the children get home from school they will be so excited to look through their bag of cards!

I don't know if any of you have seen the movie about Mr. Rogers or have read the books about him. Between Mr. Rogers and Sesame Street celebrating 50 years, I am feeling a bit nostalgic. Lucky for me I work in a school environment that the creators of Sesame Street and Mr. Rogers would love.

I mentioned in my Director's article, that we put a priority on filling each other's buckets and **being kind**. We teach the children tolerance and empathy and how to appreciate each other and make friends. These are skills that are innate but in our hurried and competitive world can be devalued. These skills are fostered in our play based, imagination building, high adult-to-child ratio classes. Being kind and inclusive does not mean being passive or submissive. It means being yourself and inviting others to be themselves and play along with you. We should also remember we are all still learning as we share our differences with each other.

I bought a book of Lyrics by Fred Rogers that I will use in the classroom from time-to- time. I am still learning too. When I looked in the index for quotes about "kindness", "kindness" was not listed. And then as I read thru the lyrics, I realized that kindness to others and to ourselves is built into all of them.

In coming back to school after the break, there can be bumps in the road. But our "kind" staff will welcome everyone back. We all have been out of our routines over the holiday. So, taking turns with toys may be a challenge when we first return. There can be some separation tears again- but they won't last long. We will be warm and loving and remind the children of the rules- children feel reassured and feel safe when they know the lines (rules) are consistent.

Kind and consistent parenting in the months to come will help children feel reassured at home too. As children grow and master something, they feel more confident. If your child suddenly says "no" or argues with you it can feel like they are challenging your authority. But really it is a sign of them growing up- which we all want our children to do. By being "kind" and calm you regain control and that actually reassures them that you are in charge. It is important to listen to their thoughts for a moment (so they feel valued). Be sure to let them know you heard them but then let them know that they need to do what you ask. We think it is best to keep it simple (don't lose control of the conversation by letting it become a big discussion) but be sure that they feel heard. You can say "I heard you but this time you need to" And if they cry or scream try to give them 2 choices (one that they will not like) and after calming down they will usually go with your choice. Staying calm is key-



And it is always helpful to remember distraction is a wonderful way to divert a child from a confrontation-it gives them a way out.
