Parent's Corner

I took a class on Lead poisoning over the break. It was a reminder to be on the lookout for sources of lead poisoning. Many of us know about lead paint on old buildings and in old pipes. The US banned lead in paint in 1978, so older homes may have lead dust or lead paint. Some soils can contain high levels of lead as well. Another source is old painted toys- so some of those wonderful hand-me-downs may contain lead. Also, old crockery or ceramics can contain lead. Many foreign countries do not have lead restrictions in current ceramics either- so buyer beware. You can purchase lead test kits online to test items in your home.

I have performed lead testing on all our faucets at school and all are safe. Also, our classroom had a roof lead 14 years ago and all of the walls, ceiling and carpeting was replaced so it is like a new classroom. Lead poisoning is dangerous to young children-partly because they put everything in their mouths. Lead accumulates in the body- and can affect your body in various ways. It can affect brain function and the nervous system and delay learning in children. To test for lead poisoning, you can ask your doctor to run a blood test for lead.
