



Outdoor school in January and February- who would have thought- only in California. So thankful for the sunny weather. Because we switched to outdoor

classes if a classmate has a positive COVID test we are not required to close the class. I will of course notify parents but by being outside we are avoiding ACPH definition of "close contact" which requires quarantine. Preschools have more restrictive protocols than K-12 schools and in January the Omicron variant caused increased community spread.

A wonderful side effect of outdoor school is inclusive social play- everyone joins in the fun. Instead of focusing on specific toys inside, the children are focusing on friendships. The COVID climate is an ever changing situation so we expect to be back indoors by the middle of February.

Right now we can truly appreciate the message of kindness and friendship that Valentine's Day brings. We are continuing our inclusion unit as well. We will re-read "Have you filled a bucket today?" to encourage friendship building in all of our classes. Learning to be a good friend is more than learning to take turns- it is learning to be empathetic and wanting good things for those around you. We will be talking about bullying in age appropriate ways too. Among other things emotional maturity includes social confidence, personal drive (I think I can- or I will try my best) and resilience. Along this same theme we will talk about not being "better" than someone else or being a winner and calling others losers. Instead we encourage the children to be the "best you can be". Parent's Corner



We just finished conferences in our PreK classes. Many parents were glad to know how well the children were doing at school. This year because of Covid protocols and staffing we have not been able to do as many writing centers. So you may see some practice writing come homeyour child can bring it back for a sticker

Now that the year is underway and the children are comfortable we encourage the children to do more themselves. At preschool we promote independence in a warm and nurturing way. You might be surprised at what your child can do if you expect a little bit more. (But of course keep it age appropriate)

So at home try:

- 1. <u>To expect more</u>- For example, your children can clean-up and find their shoes. For young children a clean-up song and a big hug is all the reward they need to be a helper. They love to help. Having them help makes them part of your family "team".
- 2. <u>Try not to do it as a parent</u> Instead have them do it themselves. I know it is quicker to do some things yourself- but resist that impulse and encourage them to do it. They will develop self-esteem and get faster with your patience.
- 3. <u>Don't redo what they have done -</u> even if they did not do it the way you would like. If they pull the covers up on the bed but there are still wrinkles- live with the wrinkles. As they get older, they will do a better and better job. Don't discourage them, the first step is trying.
- 4. <u>Encourage them to be problem solvers</u> If they get frustrated, empathize with them and talk about how to solve the problem. You can guide their thought process and the more problems they solve the more confidence they will have to tackle things on their own. Plus they will get less emotional about problems in general.
- 5. <u>Assign chores</u>- instead of "What do you want to clean up? Maybe suggest something—So maybe say "If you clean up the food, I will clean up the doll clothes". It helps them break up the big pile to clean up into smaller do-able amounts
- 6. <u>Develop routines</u>- children like to know what is going to happen next. And give them a warning before a transition- in 5 minutes we will be cleaning up.
- 7. To encourage language development in younger children- try not to anticipate their needs- make them ask in fuller sentences with please and thank you.

Of course, there will be times when all of this won't work. Try making tasks a game to make it fun. And give genuine praise- children love to do the right thing.
